Government

(Osage governance)

With the ratification of the Osage Nation Constitution in 2006 and the newly formed three-branch government system with executive, legislative, and judicial branches. The three branches are set up to limit each other's power through a series of restraints known as checks and balances.

Laws are enacted and funds are appropriated by the Legislative Branch consisting of 12 Congressional members who elect a Speaker and the Second Speaker.

Programs and day to day business of the Nation is administered under the Executive Branch through the Principal Chief, Assistant Principal Chief, staff members and program directors.

The Judicial Branch is responsible for interpreting the Constitution and laws of the Osage Nation.

The Osage Minerals Council is recognized by the Osage Nation Constitution as an independent agency within the Osage Nation established for the sole purpose of continuing its previous duties to administer and develop the Osage Mineral Estate in accordance with the Osage Allotment Act of June 28, 1906. The Osage Minerals Council consists of eight elected council members that serve as the administrative authority for the mineral affairs of the Osage Mineral Estate with a Chairman, Second Chair, and 6 council members.

Legislative Branch

LEGISLATIVE PROCESS FLOW CHART

START

Legislative ideas from all sources may seek sponsorship by a member of Congress. Member orders research and/or drafting of legislation.

Sponsor files bill with the Clerk. Bill is numbered, printed, and posted to the Congressional website. Speaker places bill on the session agenda; Sponsor gives first reading. Speaker refers bill to General Order or appropriate Committee.

The Committee considers the bill.

If the Committee takes no action the bill stops.

On General Order
Day 3 amendments
are voted on in the
order presented.
Amendments from
Day 2 may be further
amended.

On General Order Day 2, amendments are presented to the bill with no debate.

The bill is placed on General Order Day 1 on the next legislative day. The Sponsor reads the bill into the record. The Committee reports the bill with a recommendation to the floor of the Congress.

By rule, the Speaker may move a bill from Committee to the floor without Committee consent, as may 8 members of Congress by signature.

ENDORSEMENT

The Speaker refers
the bill from General
Order with passed
amendments, if any, to
Engrossment, where
amendments are
incorporated into the bill.

ENGROSSMENT

The Rules and Ethics Committee reviews the Engrossed bill for accuracy, and reports the bill back to the floor of Congress.

The Speaker places the bill on Second Reading of the Session Agenda. On Second Reading the bill is debated. A final vote is taken on the bill and alternate effective date, if any.

If the bill does not pass, the bill dies.

At anytime after a bill is introduced, the rules may be suspended if at least eight members of Congress concur. Suspension is often for specific reasons, such as accelerating a bill's progress, holding it in place, moving it from General Order or Second Reading back to Committee (known as "committing the bill") or other

action desired by the

Congress.

If Congress does not attempt to override or attempts to override and fails, the bill dies. If the bill is vetoed, it is returned with objections to the Congress.

The bill is presented to the Principal Chief for signature.

If passed in the last 3 days of session and the Principal Chief does not sign within 5 days, the bill has received a Pocket Veto and dies.

With a minimum of nine votes to override the Principal Chief's veto, the bill becomes law. The bill is signed.
Appropriations may be line item vetoed while approving the bill.
Nine members may override the veto.

If the bill is not signed & returned within 5 days (except for Sundays/Holidays and unless passed during the last 3 days of session) the bill becomes law.*

*Bill becomes law 60 days after they are signed by the Principal Chief, or by the Speaker after Congressional override. An alternate effective date may be passed with a minimum of eight votes in the Congress.
