4. Superintendent Report – Superintendent Trumbly

Superintendent Trumbly states the superintendent report is as follows: Total oil produced 262,089.53, royalties paid \$2,773,385.35, total gas produced 115,840 MCF, royalties paid \$60,533.65, total gas liquids 157,641 gallons, royalties paid \$26,770.41, total tank bottom 1,576.99, royalties paid \$4,510.34, water usage royalty paid \$150.00, and waste disposal royalty paid \$0. Rentals/Bonus - Oil and Gas Rentals Paid \$3,000.00, Oil and Gas Bonus Paid \$100.00, Rental \$200.00, Saltwater Easement Rental \$3,000.00, Late Payment Charge \$583.20. Aggregates - APAC produced 9,787.15 tons and paid \$12,047.98 in royalty (February). Candy Creek produced 7,771.46 tons and paid \$9,636.61 in royalty (January). Burbank Materials produced 16,814.41 tons and paid \$21,822.44 in royalty (January). Rocky Banks produced 360 cubic yards and paid \$270.00 in royalty (January). Wilson Ranch produced 267 tons and paid \$133.50 in royalty (February). Schmidt Brothers produced 0 cubic yards and paid \$0.00 in royalty. Producing wells -16,464, oil wells -11,943, oil and gas wells -114, gas wells -1,349, TA'd – 492, Injection Wells – 1,254, Injection w/easement – 8, CO₂ Injection – 72, Water/Gas Injection – 51, SWD w/easement – 130, SWD w/o easement – 942, Water Supply Well – 102, Water Supply Well w/easement - 2. Permits issued – 3 workover, 8 plugging, 1 emergency plugging, 0 emergency workover, and 0 drilling permits. There are 0 new drilling completions to report. Councilman Cheshewalla asks about the Total Tank Bottom number since it is much higher than usual and is told that a team is auditing and catching the variances. Councilman Revard ask about the lower oil production numbers and Superintendent Trumbly states he is unaware of why since that was the



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month he was not here. Councilman Revard also asks about the \$0 revenue for waste disposal wells and who obtained the eight plugging permits. Superintendent Trumbly responds that he is unaware about the waste disposal well revenue and that all eight of the well plugging permits were to CapturePoint. Councilman Waller states that we did see list last month showing that the ON plugged three wells in the last two months. Councilman Redcorn comments on the keepers and Councilman Revard asks about the equipment from the ON plugged wells and what they are doing with it. Fred Beartrack, ON Well Plugging Program, states that they have done 27 and all had been terminated. He also states that they are making notes about special circumstances regarding any of the plugged wells. Councilman Redcorn states that a discussion may be needed about the ownership of the Pipeyard since it was purchased with shareholder funds. Councilman Shackelford asks Mr. Beartrack if there have been discussions with OMC Geologist, Bill Lynn, regarding any of the wells and asking him to check them out. Mr. Beartrack states that there has not been any yet. He also states that the solicitor told them not to put pressure down the well for liability reasons. He notes that wells are prioritized on Osage land if two wells were equal.

5. BTFA Update - Troyce Garringer

Ms. Garringer introduces herself and Stephanie Davis, Trust Accounts Administrator. She states that constituents can call the Pawhuska office Monday-Friday, 8 am – 4:30 pm at 918.287.5791. She also states they can contact the Call Center at 1.888.678.6836, Monday-Friday, 10:00 am – 5:30 pm CST. Ms. Garringer reports that the BTFA nationwide piloting program for online access of accounts goes live on August 1, 2025. Councilman Redcorn asks Lacee Reynolds, OMC Chief of Staff, if the OMC still receives quarterly reports and what name is shown on those reports and is told that it is addressed to the Osage Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma. Councilman Redcorn states concerns that it is not addressed to Osage Annuitants. Ms. Garringer states that would be a topic to address to the solicitors. Chairman Red Eagle asks about names and addresses for the election and is told that he needs to contact Superintendent Trumbly. She states that it is generated by the Superintendent and changes made in the BTFA interfaces with the BIA.
